Practices of deep listening to each other, so they understood the needs and could meet those needs.




Relational Fabric


Your Priorities for the Future

New Initiatives in 2022



FAB School for Ministry

The School's first initiative is the discernment and formation of licensed lay ministers. In January 2023, we will commission the first cohort of lay ministers who have discerned their vocation and have been formed for licensure as lay preachers, catechists, pastoral care givers, pastoral leaders, and worship leaders

Genesis II: Re-Vision & Renew

We partnered with the Presiding Bishop's office to work with small congregations in the Diocese of Atlanta. This is a journey of exploration for congregations to reflect on their identity, God's call, and how to "be" church in new ways in their communities.





Leaders CARE

We partnered with the Society for the Increase in Ministry (SIM) to secure a grant from Trinity Wallstreet to train leaders in spiritual practices, grounded in prayer and formation, that will help leaders discern and embrace God's future for their churches.
